Show and tell was a Parkzone Spitfire EP RTF.





DSM Modelaires New Pilot Help

The club pilot instructors do a great job training new students the

basics of flying, spending many hours of volunteer time. However once the students has the basics down, the cord between the transmitter and buddy box gets pulled, and the student is pushed from the nest and the instructor picks up a new student pilot. New pilots that have recently soloed still need to gain experience and confidence, and get to know other club members who can assist. Experienced pilots who may not have the time or desire to be instructors often help out new pilots with questions at the field. However the new pilot may not know popular times to fly and may end up at the field attempting to fly alone. I had suggested a list of volunteer pilots that new pilots could call to arrange a flying time so they would not be flying alone. The new pilot could ask questions, get help trimming an aircraft, and have a experienced pilot assisting with flight line safety. The expectation is the new pilot would get to know other members and when popular flying times are, and not be using the list for multiple seasons. In June of 2012 the AMA Advanced Flight Systems Committee (AFSC) was created for the purpose of developing operational policies and guidelines for advanced flight systems used in radio controlled model aircraft.

The committee's first project was to evaluate and revise AMA's current policies for "R/C Model Aircraft Operations Utilizing First Person View Systems" (AMA Document #550) and "R/C Model Aircraft Operations Utilizing Failsafe, Stabilization & Autopilot Systems" (AMA Document #560).

The committee in a collaborative effort with leading members of the hobby industry and FPV community revised these documents and presented this report to the Executive Council during the October 20, 2012 council meeting. Revisions were made and the report and documents were adopted by the council.
