President's Message

* We recently had three separate incidents with electric powered planes, one resulting in a pretty nasty series of cuts on a forearm. We do have a field rule that somewhat addresses the cause of these incidents, but in of its self might not have prevented them.

The first incident was as I walked away from the flight line with my Valiant. Before I picked up the plane I engaged the throttle cut and while walking away from the flight line shut off my transmitter. To my great surprise the propeller started to turn. Fortunately it was at very low power and only struck my pants on the thigh. No damage, but a potentially serious situation. I then realized I had not reset the fail safe after changing to a different speed control. The new speed control required a lower low throttle position than the old one.

The second incident involved a new plane without the throttle cut enabled, a short transmitter strap and a wayward coat, all on the way to the flight line. Fortunately this only caused a few moments of near panic and a broken stringer.

The third incident was quite a bit more serious as nearly full throttle resulted in several cuts to the forearm, a trip to the hospital and some stitches.

The field rules require that we not arm the power circuit to the motor until we have the plane at the flight station, but it would be best if the plane were on the runway approach before it is armed. And power should be disconnected BEFORE the plane is removed from the runway approach.

After these incidents the question was asked, "How, where do I make adjustments to my plane if I require my field box or if I want to free up a flight station?" I believe that if the propeller is removed from the plane you can do whatever adjustments you need wherever it's convenient. I'd like some feedback on this before we change the field rules to reflect this change.

Electric motors with the power connected are every bit as dangerous as a gun without a safety.

Sig Cub Rudder Band Powered Kit Converted to Electric Radio Control and Power



The model was originally a Sig Cub. It started with a 24 inch wing with dihedral but I added another 6 inches of wing and polyhedral. I also added area to the tail surfaces and gave it an elevator. The electronics came from an old UMX GB R2. Much to my surprise, it flies wonderfully, very stable and gentle like the rubber band powered model.

My first AS3Xtra indoor plane got pretty beat up while I learned to fly it over a couple of year period inside. Despite glue, tooth picks and stiffening foam the airframe got so twisted it was very difficult to fly. The servos, motor, and receiver control board all continued to work fine. One day at Hobby Haven I noticed by the front door a display of kid's balsa gliders. I noticed that the Strato Streak was about the same size as the AS3Xtra. With the addition of foam control surfaces and the equipment from the AS3Xtra, it flies pretty good. It won't hover or maneuver like a new AS3Xtra but it works. However it is about the ugliest RC airplane I have ever seen.




