June Meeting Minutes


June 4, 2013 7:00PM Director's Meeting

Runway Communication + Courtesy = Safety

The Des Moines Modelaires has been blessed to have two flying fields both with multiple runways. But just because a field has two runways does not mean it would be safe to use both at the same time. We all need to remember when we arrive at the flying field we can't just unload our flying machines and depart from the nearest runway. If others are at the field then the "active" runway is the runway actively being used. It would be unsafe to use the parallel runway as it is impossible to "see and avoid" other aircraft flying crossing patterns. It is also a basic courtesy to fly with others vs against them; this includes flying a standard pattern with others. For safety reason the Des Moines Modelaires has also established a maximum of four (4) aircraft in the air at one time.

Does this mean you never can use the perpendicular runway? Not necessarily. Doing so simply requires active communication and coordination. For example the active runway could support fixed wing aircraft while the far end of the perpendicular runway may support helicopters, gliders, or even 3D foamy aircraft. This does require active communication and coordination with the members using the active runway to ensure there are no conflicts, or distractions, created by using the far end of the parallel runway.

Bottom-line is: if an aircraft is in the air that is the ACTIVE runway and no one should be taking off from the parallel runway without discussing it first. In the rare event the flying members understand you will be taking off from the "non active" runway you must immediately join the pattern being flown on the active runway.

There is also no reason for anyone to be standing on the runway at anytime to launch, or fly, any aircraft without communicating with the other members to make sure everyone is aware what you are doing and why!

Finally, lets remember to always shout what we are doing such as taking-off, landing, on the runway, clear of the runway, etc. This all adds to our safety.


Runway Communication + Courtesy = Safety and safety is what we should all be striving for while we enjoy this wonderful hobby of ours.
