Earlier this year on one of my visits to the EPJ field I came onto quite a sight! Dave Kalwishky had brought his 7/8 scale P38 Lightning. I had never seen such a large-scale model of a fantastic World War II P38 plane. The sheer size was staggering and how was he able to bring it to the field?

He vowed he would fly it before he left. The detail on this craft was amazing and was concerned that the machine guns in the nose were actually working 50 calibers! I do not remember whether the 20MM canon worked or not. I would have liked to have seen them in action but would not be safe anywhere around the airport. Such an interesting machine I was always looking for stories about them. At one time I thought I had read that the plane was actually two earlier fighter models torn apart then put back together in this new configuration. I am sure that was just a story.



I seem to remember reading a story, as told by a German fighter Pilot, when he had his first run in with what he and his 2 comrades thought was a Bomber. Two of them dove on this "Single Bomber" thinking it would be an easy target. Before they could think it rolled upside down and came up behind and shot one down and damaged the other one. 
A New Equipment Report from LaVerne Sanders

One of my winter projects was adding a laser system to my machine list. It is a 7-watt solid state diode system from a company called J Tech Photonics. https://itechphotonics.com/?product=acro-laser-and-electronics-bundle

The system is great for engraving a good variety of materials as well as light cutting projects. And, as all good machine systems go, it requires yet another software system to run the laser. The product I use for this system is called Lightburn.

Lightburn can be used to do simpler drawings or add images to engrave. Or,



or cut. Then export the file in a DXF format that Lightburn can directly import and process.



I have lots of experimenting/learning to do with the system. One recent project was a new entry sign for West Field. I started with a 2-color outdoor sign material. After some experimenting with power settings, I used a setting of 6% of total power to engrave the new

sign. It was a fun project and one I was pleased with the results. I'm also doing some

leather engraving for a company in town. Another opportunity to learn more about using a laser system.



You never know when some airplane project is going to need something that only a laser can do! Good luck with the 2019 flying season and see you at the field.

- E2 EPJ 3 point landing of a WW1 Plane.






- E3 EPJ Jet slowed down so I could get a photo.

- W1 West "GLIDER" This had an electric motor and flew very fast and was slowed down for the photo. Once this GLIDER reached the height wanted shutting down the motor causes the prop to fold back around the nose to reduce air resistance! Not sure what the trailing wire was?
- W2 West Great take off into the wind.
- W3 West Fan Jet taking off in a short distance.
- W4 West Hand launch of battery powered craft with the prop on the rear just barely visible. No landing gear!

The pilots always make flying these planes look easy!!
























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Learn to Fly RC!



The Des Moines Modelaires maintains two high-quality, friendly flying locations in the Des Moines area. See below for address and map information:


