Duane announced his pride in our club for hosting the 75th Anniversary Fun Fly, that it was well attended with flyers and spectators alike.

The next subject was - SAFETY. There was another propeller blade strike, on the inner forearm of a member. Several members have made a number of complaints about flight line safety. I. Electrics must not be armed until you are on the flight line. This means NOT attaching the battery unless you have a kill switch of some type installed. Several pilots have gotten careless about their flight path. After takeoff, the flight of you aircraft must be outside of the runway. Do not allow your plane to fly over the pits, or, to fly west of the runway even at the outer ends. Do not fly toward the pits, even during approaches. You must make your calls - "take-off", "landing", "on the field", whenever you are going to undertake any of those actions. Landings always have priority. Our club rules, to include saftey rules, are posted at each field. This is a reminder that each member should periodically read those rules and make sure you are obeying them.

The last Sunday of September, the 25th, will be a work and clean-up day at EPJ Field. Included with this will be the installation of some additional safety fencing. A reminder that the TAG training season is over for this year. We had a lot of new flyers try this with us, and gained several new members from it. Our new solar charging station at Westfield is well received and is being used daily. Jim Lewis announced that ReMax has told us that they will now require a \$25.00 per month fee for our winter meeting room. Motion made and seconded, vote passed, to pay this fee.

Upcoming events: The Newton club on Saturday night, 9-10, is holding a night flying event. Our fall Swap Meet and Auction is scheduled for October 8. Jim volunteered to run the swap/sales table for Don McKenna;s equipment.


Tips & Tricks

To clean your airplane after a day at the field use my formula, which is as follows:

- 5 cups of water (40 oz.)
- 1 cup of denatured alcohol (8 oz.) 1/2 cup of ammonia (4 oz.)
- 1 oz. of dish detergent

If you would like to try something different, try using lemon Pledge spray wax. It cuts through the caster lubricant and grease, and cleans and polishes the surface leaving the aircraft with a protective coating without any residue.

The usual technique of building two identical sides by building one above the other usually results in the sides requiring careful separation with a razor blade. This can be eliminated by placing pieces of Scotch Magic Mending Tape over each glue joint, thus preventing the second side from adhering to the first.
